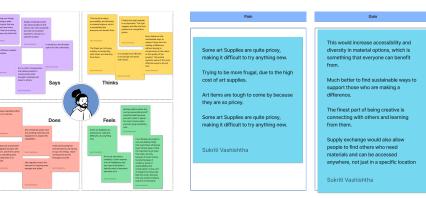

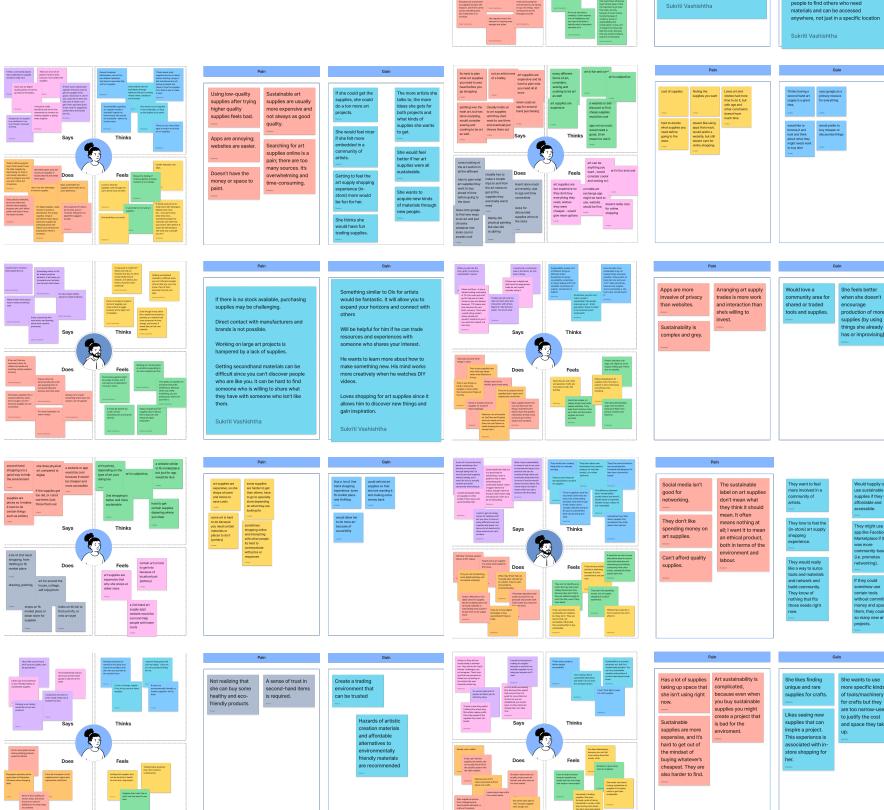

Sustainability in art is more complicated than it sounds.

Quality of supplies is important; it's hard to go back to low-quality supplies, even when it's hard to afford nicer things.

Hobbyists want to feel more involved in the artist community.

Artists love in-person shopping so they can look at and feel the different materials; they are inspiring.

Affordability is more important than sustainability.

Many artists prefer to get their supplies second-hand because it's cheaper AND more sustainable.

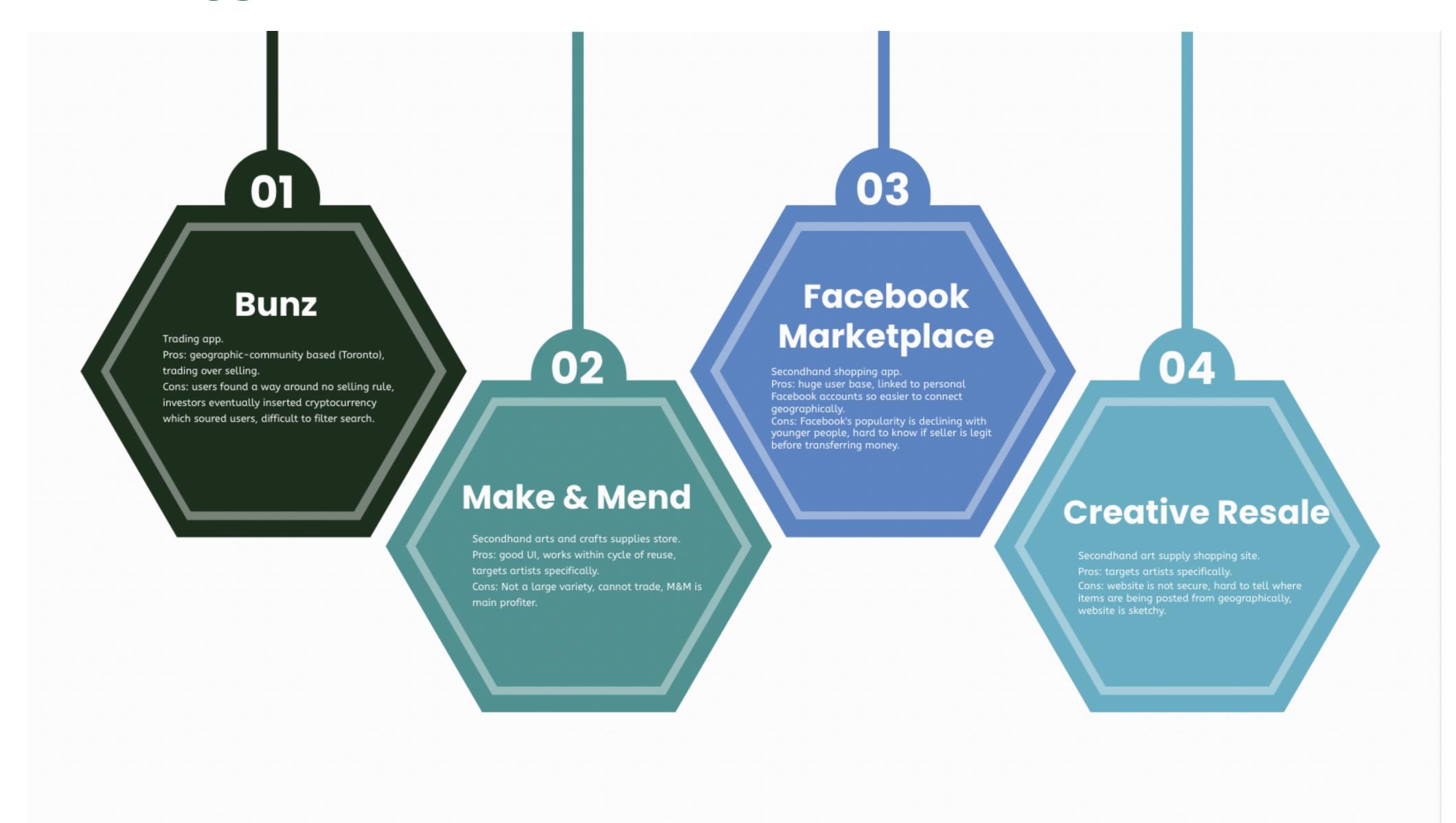
Hobbyist artists like helping each other succeed.

Katie feels like she succeeds when she helps other artists start or complete their projects.

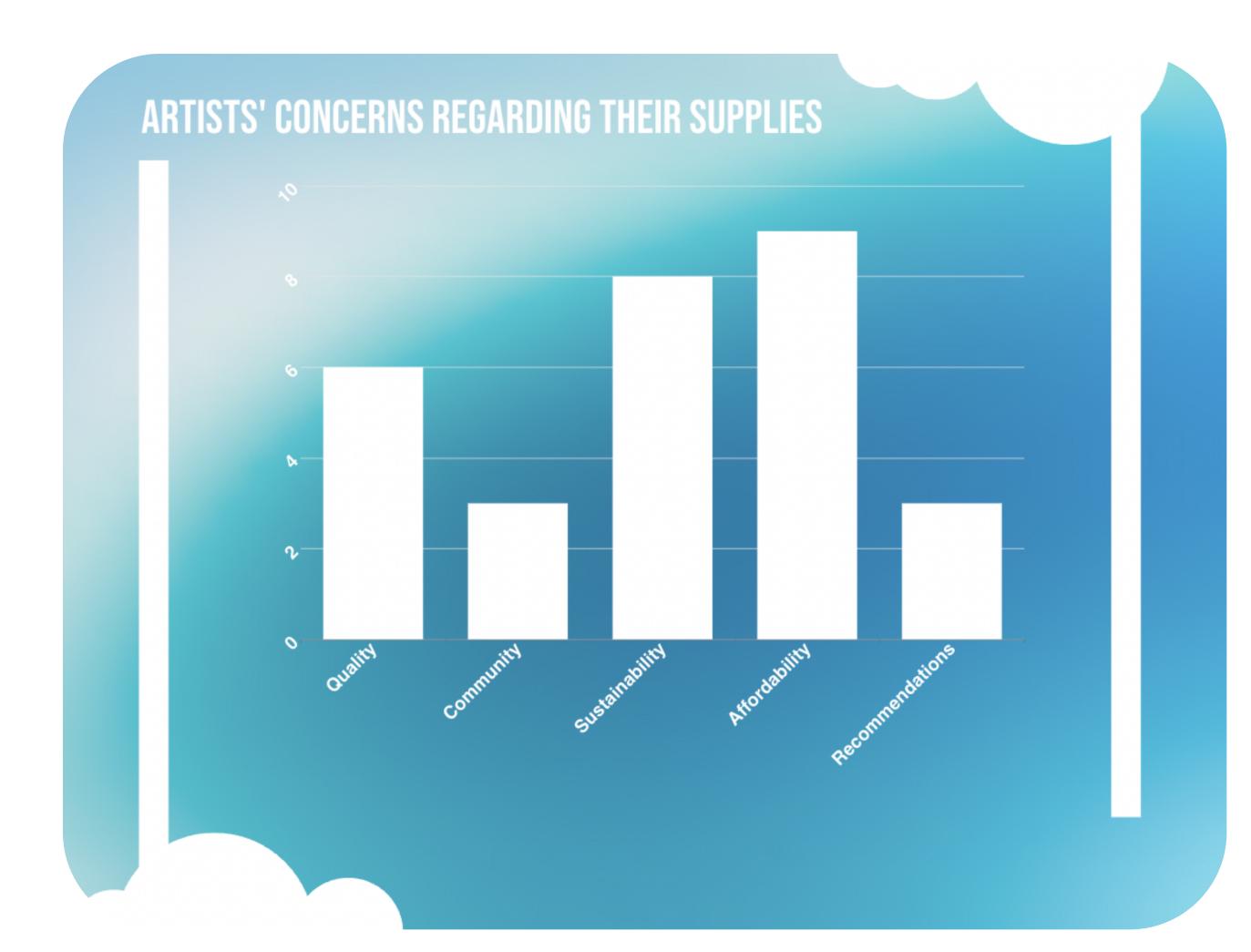
Seeing new art supplies inspires Katie to make new projects, which makes her happy.

Katie loves the feeling of shopping in art supply stores; she gets great inspiration for new projects when she shops.

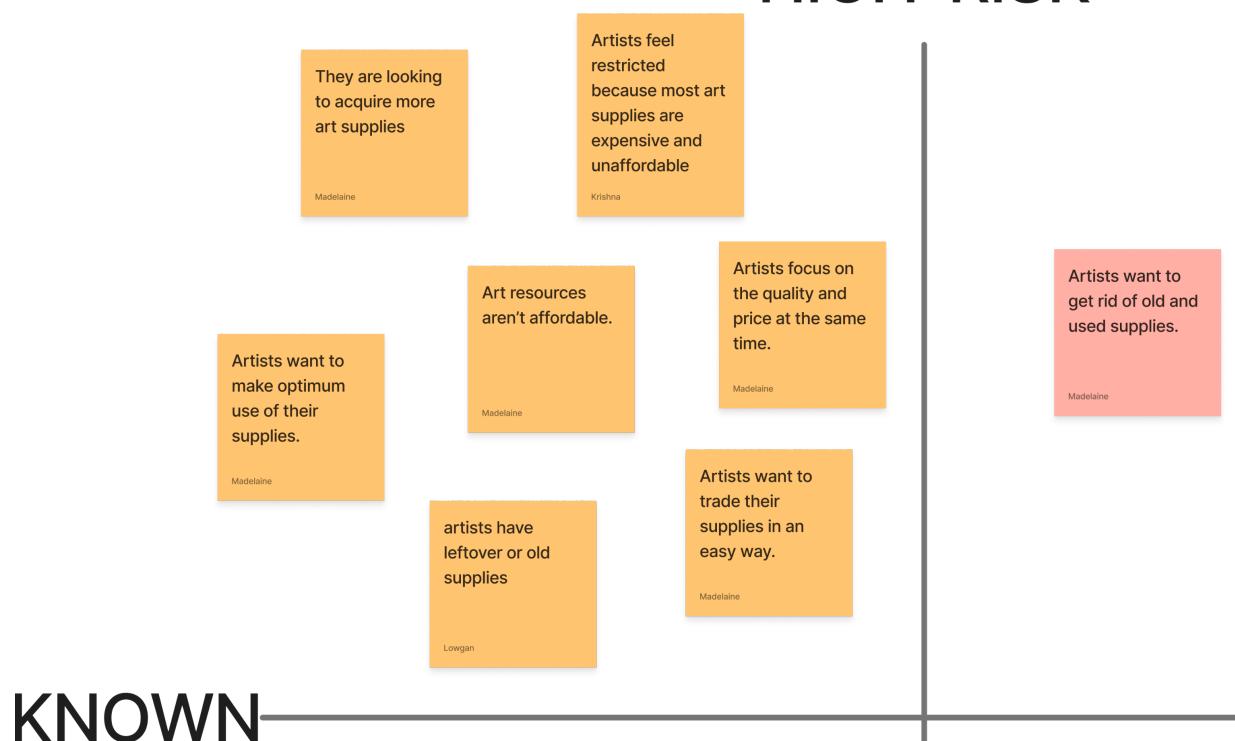
Katie likes when her shopping is fast and straightfoward; she doesn't have much free time to spare and she knows what she's looking for.

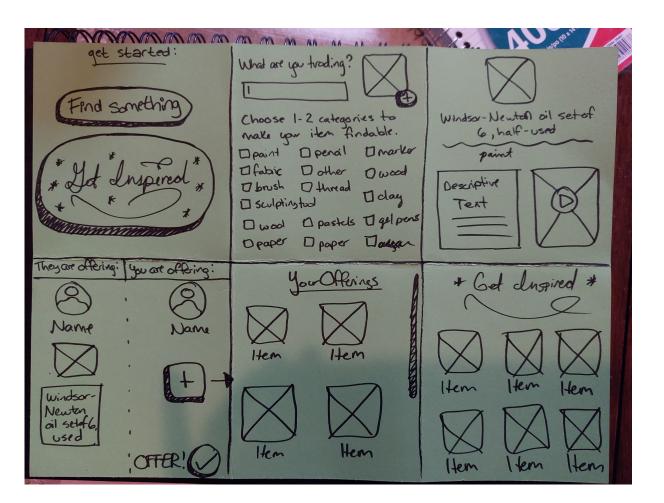

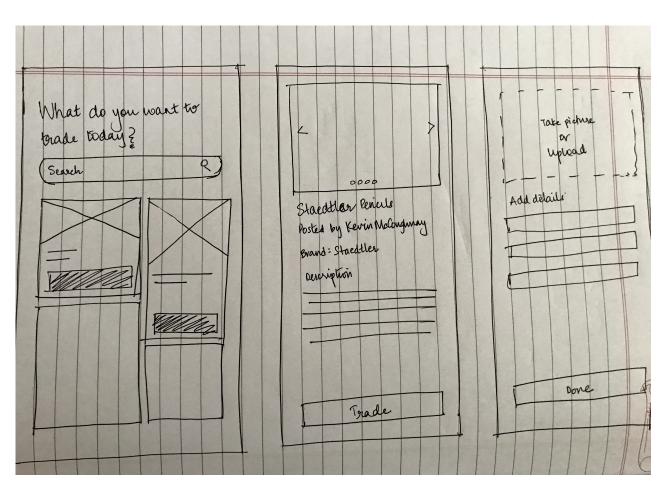
## Hypothesis

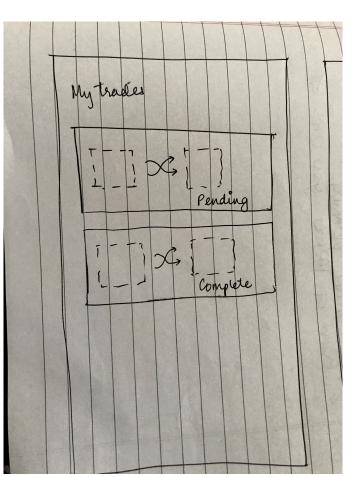
We believe that by facilitating the trade of art supplies between hobbyists we can help artists acquire new resources and get rid of old or used ones.

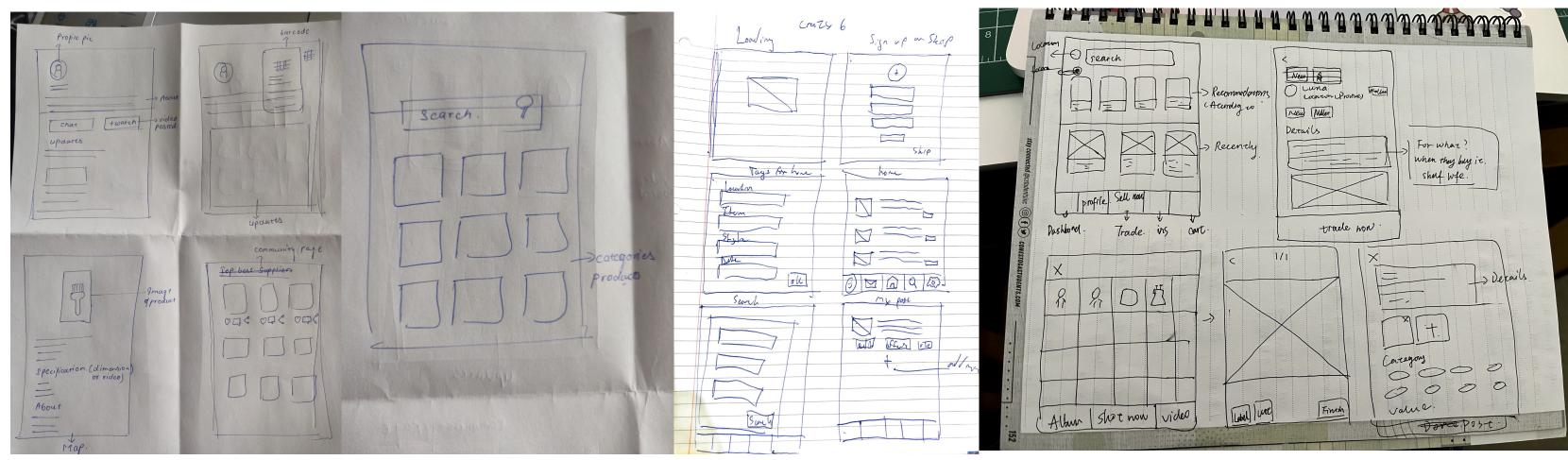
We will know this to be true when hobbyists use this app to facilitate supply trades.
